WHO CAN TAKE THE COURSE?

Anyone licensed, certified or registered in their state to perform physical examinations, including nurse practitioners (NPs) and other advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs), physician assistants (PAs), medical doctors (MDs), Doctors of Osteopathic Medicine (DOs) and Doctors of Chiropractic (DC).

DOES THE PROGRAM OFFER CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) AND IS IT ACCREDITED?

The American Association of Nurse Practitioners® (AANP) meets the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) qualifications to provide this course. It is accredited by AANP in accordance with AANP accreditation standards and policies. The 2019 program offers 5.5 contact hours of CE.

HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR THE COURSE?

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO COMPLETE THE COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE (CMV) EXAMINER TRAINING COURSE?

It takes the average participant about 5.5 hours to complete. Each of the 12 modules are taken one at a time at your convenience but must be completed within one full year from the date of purchase. You will have access to all videos and materials during this year.

AANP's CMV medical examiner (ME) training course is designed to ensure that health care providers, including NPs and other APRNs, PAs, MDs, DOs and DCs, are educated on the core curriculum established by the FMCSA in preparation to sit for the National Registry of Certification Medical Examiners (NRCME) certification examination. This course also includes step-by-step guidance, forms, FAQs and a study guide for in-depth review and preparation for the NRCME certification examination.

COURSE CONTENT INCLUDES:

1. Background, rationale, mission and goals of the FMCSA and ME's roles and responsibilities.
2. Familiarization with the responsibilities and work environment of CMV operation.
3. Identification of the operator and obtaining, reviewing and documenting operator medical history, including prescription and over-the-counter medications.
4. Performing, reviewing and documenting the operator's medical examination. Knowledge of exemptions and waivers.
5. Performing, obtaining and documenting additional diagnostic tests or medical opinion from a medical specialist or treating providers' clearances, as needed.
6. Informing and educating the operator about disqualifying medications and nondisqualifying medical conditions that require remedial care.
7. Determining operator certification outcome and period for which certification should be valid.
8. FMCSA reporting and documentation requirements.
