



## **Government Affairs Update**

October 3, 2022

#### This Week in Washington, D.C.

On Thursday, Sept. 29, the Senate passed a short-term spending measure — commonly referred to as a continuing resolution — which extended funding for the federal government until Dec. 16. On Friday, Sept. 30, the House of Representatives took up and passed this legislation, and it was signed into law by the President. As reported previously, funding for the federal government was set to expire at midnight on Sept. 30.

Members of both the Senate and House returned home to begin state and district work periods. The Senate is at home this week and is scheduled to return to Washington, D.C., on Oct. 11 through Oct. 24. Senators are then expected to return to their home states, where they will remain until after the November election. The House's district work period is scheduled to continue beyond the election, and they will return to Washington, D.C., the week of Nov. 14.

# Amendment to Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness (PREP) Act

On Oct. 3, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) issued a notice of amendment under the PREP Act. This amendment emphasizes that the PREP Act declaration applies to the monkeypox virus and expands the categories of providers — including NPs — who are authorized to administer vaccines and therapeutics against smallpox (variola virus), monkeypox virus and other orthopoxviruses in a declared emergency. ## HHS Declares Public Health Emergencies for Florida, South Carolina and Puerto Rico

On Sept. 21, HHS Secretary Xavier Becerra declared a <u>public health emergency (PHE) for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico</u> due to the flooding impact of Hurricane Fiona. The declaration follows President Biden's <u>disaster declaration</u> and gives the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), health care providers and suppliers greater flexibility in meeting the emergency health needs of CMS beneficiaries. Pursuant to this declaration, CMS announced <u>resources and flexibilities to assist with the PHE in Puerto Rico</u>.

On Sept. 26, Secretary Becerra also declared a PHE for Florida in response to Hurricane Ian. The declaration follows President Biden's emergency declaration and gives health care providers and suppliers greater flexibility in meeting emergency health needs of CMS beneficiaries. Pursuant to this declaration, CMS announced resources and flexibilities to assist with the PHE in Florida. The Florida Department of Health has established an emergency information webpage that includes emergency information resources.

On Sept. 30, Secretary Becerra declared a <u>PHE for the state of South Carolina</u> to address the health impacts of Hurricane Ian. The declaration also follows President Biden's <u>emergency</u> <u>declaration</u>, giving CMS, health care providers and suppliers greater flexibility in meeting emergency health needs of Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries. Pursuant to this declaration, CMS announced <u>resources</u> and <u>flexibilities</u> to assist with the PHE in South Carolina.

#### Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Announces New Awards for Rural Opioid Response

On Sept. 23, HRSA announced investments of more than \$104 million to expand treatment and prevention services for substance use disorder in rural communities nationwide as part of the Rural Communities Opioid Response Program (RCORP), a multi-year initiative aimed at reducing the morbidity and mortality of rural Americans from substance use. #### Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Coverage Renewal

CMS created a <u>website</u> with state-by-state renewal information in preparation for the unwinding of the COVID-19 public health emergency for individuals who need to renew their Medicaid or Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) coverage or apply for another type of health care

coverage. CMS is encouraging clinicians to utilize physicals, vaccinations and other care events to ensure their eligible patients are enrolled in Medicaid or CHIP and are aware of upcoming eligibility renewals. This includes discussing with patients the importance of ensuring that Medicaid and CHIP agencies have accurate contact information on file and ensuring patients are checking their mail regularly for renewal forms and other relevant materials. CMS also released a resource to inform clinicians about the Medicaid and CHIP renewal process.
