Nurse Practice Act: M.C.L.A. 333.17201

Regulatory Structure: Restricted Practice

Michigan law restricts patient access to nurse practitioner (NP) care.

Michigan law requires physician delegation for NP controlled substance prescribing.

Requirements include a registered nurse license and national certification.

CE hours as required for national certification.

Medical Staff Membership**

Each board of trustees and subsidiary board may select NPs for membership on their medical staff.

Signature Recognition on Items of Patient Care

- Physical Therapy: NPs may order physical therapy.

- Parking Permits: NPs are authorized to provide proof of disability for disabled parking permits.

- DNR: NPs are not currently authorized to sign Do Not Resuscitate orders.
M.C.L.A. 333.1053
- Death Certificates: NPs are not currently authorized to sign death certificates.

- Michigan Provider Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST)/Physician Orders for Sustaining Treatment (POST):
NPs are authorized to sign the POST form.
