Regulatory Structure: Reduced Practice

Ohio constrains nurse practitioner (NP) licensure and practice.

Ohio NPs must have a career-long standard care arrangement with a collaborating physician or podiatrist. See the Board of Nursing for more information. R.C. § 4723.43

Ohio NPs must also abide by patient and settings limitations on Schedule II medications in state law. See Board of Nursing for more information. R.C. § 4723.481

Regulatory Agency

NP licensure is regulated exclusively by the Board of Nursing. R.C. § 4723.06

Licensure Requirements

Requirements include a registered nurse license, a graduate degree in an NP role and national certification. R.C. § 4723.41

Schedule II Controlled Substance Prescriptive Authority

NPs are not authorized to prescribe Schedule II controlled substances in convenient care clinics. R.C. § 4723.481

Continuing Education (CE)*

Twenty-four CE hours are required every two years. See the BON for details. R.C. § 4723.24

Medical Staff Membership[†]

Medical staff composition is determined by a facility's governing body. R.C. § 3701.351

Primary Care Providers

NPs are defined in law as primary care providers. OAC 5160-26-01

Supervisory Agreement Ratio ‡

One physician or podiatrist may enter into supervisory care agreements with no more than five nurses for prescribing practice. R.C. § 4723.431

Signature Recognition on Items of Patient Care

- Physical Therapy: NPs are authorized to refer to physical therapy. R.C. § 4755.48
- Parking Permits: NPs are authorized to provide proof of disability for disabled parking permits. R.C. § 4503.44
- DNR: NPs are authorized to sign Do Not Resuscitate orders. R.C. § 2133.211
- Death Certificates: NPs are not presently authorized to sign death certificates. R.C. § 3705.16
