# **Nurse Practice Act**

W.S.A. 441.001

# **Regulatory Structure: Reduced Practice**

Wisconsin constrains nurse practitioner (NP) licensure and practice.

Wisconsin NPs must have a collaborative relationship with a physician as a condition of practice. See the Board of Nursing for more information. Wis. Adm. Code § N 8.10

Wisconsin NPs are prohibited from prescribing, dispensing or administering certain Schedule II controlled substances. Exemptions may apply. See the Board of Nursing for more information. *Wis. Adm. Code § N 8.06* 

# **Regulatory Agency**

NP licensure is regulated exclusively by the Board of Nursing (BON). Wis. Adm. Code § N 8.01

#### **Licensure Requirements**

Requirements include a registered nurse license, a graduate degree in an NP role and national certification. WI ADC s N 8.03

# Continuing Education (CE)\*

Sixteen CE hours are required every two years. See the BON for details. WI ADC s N 8.05

#### Malpractice Insurance

NPs are required to have professional malpractice liability insurance as determined by the BON. WI ADC s N 8.08

#### Medical Staff Membership<sup>†</sup>

Medical staff composition is determined by the governing body's procedures at each facility. Wis. Adm. Code § DHS 124.02

### Signature Recognition on Items of Patient Care

- Physical Therapy: NPs are authorized to refer to physical therapy. W.S.A. 448.56
- Parking Permits: NPs are authorized to provide proof of disability for disabled parking permits. W.S.A. 341.14
- DNR: NPs are authorized to sign Do Not Resuscitate orders. W.S.A. 154.19
- Death Certificates: NPs are not currently authorized to sign death certificates. W.S.A. 69.18
- Wisconsin POLST/Physician Orders for Scope of Treatment (POST): NPs may sign Wisconsin's POST form.
